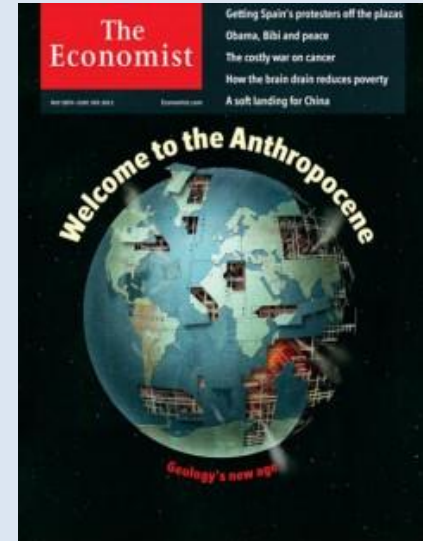
The anthropocene: how do we cope with complexity ?

 - Visioning needs processes
 - Transdisciplinarity is a tough challenge to r&d
 - Reading the signs of regulatory competitiveness

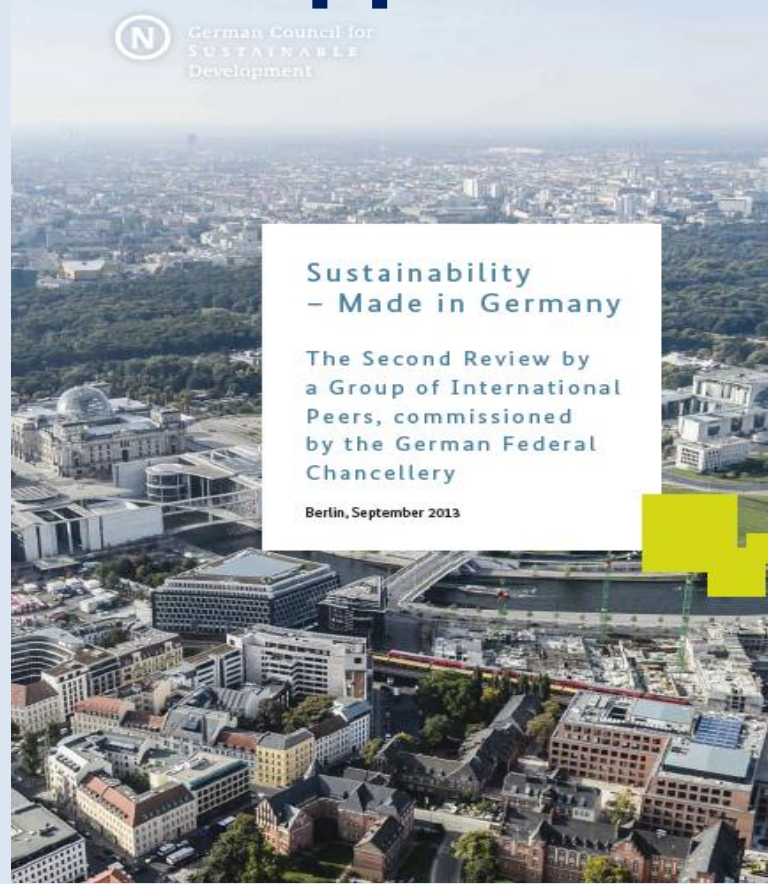
